## January 2011

The National Scene: On Tuesday, January 4, Dr. John M. Haas, NCBC President was notified by Archbishop Zygmunt Zimowski, President of the *Pontifical Council for Health* Care Workers, that the Holy Father had appointed him a Consultor to the Council. In 2006 Pope Benedict XVI appointed Dr. Haas as an Ordinary Member of the Pontifical Academy for Life and then in June 2010 named him to the eight member Governing Council of the Academy. • On January 20, three new bills on important pro-life issues were introduced into Congress: The No Taxpaver Funding for Abortion Act (H.R. 3), the Protect Life Act (H.R. 358). and the Abortion Non-Discrimination Act (H.R. 361). See: http://nchla.org/actiondisplay.asp?ID=286; http://nchla.org/actiondisplay.asp?ID=287; http://www.usccb.org/comm/archives/2011/11-021.shtml. • On January 5, 2011, the Obama administration rescinded the advanced care planning provision from its newly effective (January 1, 2011) Medicare Regulations. This provision was not included in the request for public comment in the Federal Register in July. but did appear in the final regulation, published in November.<sup>2</sup> The National Catholic Bioethics Center had responded to the new *Medicare Regulations* as it pertained to this provision.3

The State of Conscience/Religious Liberty: See the federal important pro-life issues, above.

The State of Marriage: The United States Supreme Court did not accept the appeal of the decision of the Washington, DC Human Rights Commission. The Commission concluded that it would be discriminatory to give citizens a choice to define marriage as a union between a man and a woman. The District of Columbia Council approved same-sex marriages in 2009.<sup>4</sup> • In 2009, an lowa Supreme Court ruling legalized same sex marriage, thus, legislating from the courts that such unions be recognized legally. The lowa Legislature is advancing a bill to pursue a constitutional amendment which would define marriage as between one man and one woman.<sup>5</sup> • The Wyoming Legislature is advancing legislation that would prohibit recognition of out-of-state homosexual marriages in Wyoming.<sup>6</sup> At the same time they are considering a proposal to legally recognize civil unions.<sup>7</sup> • The Maryland General Assembly has proposed several bills to legalize same-sex unions in that state.<sup>8</sup> • Same-sex couples in Montana are seeking through the courts civil union or domestic partner status. Montana voters approved a marriage amendment to their constitution in 2004, which defined marriage as between one man and one woman.<sup>9</sup> • A bill to legalize same-sex civil unions is advancing in Hawaii.<sup>10</sup>

State by State: A bill to restrict abortions to the period before the fetus can experience pain has been proposed in the lowa Legislature.\(^{11}\) • The Kansas Legislature is considering legislation to tighten a ban on abortions after 22 weeks gestation.\(^{12}\) Similarly, Ohio is considering a bill to prohibit post-viability abortions.\(^{13}\) • Mississippi voters will have the opportunity to vote on a constitutional amendment to protect the personhood of the unborn in November.\(^{14}\) • The Wyoming Legislature defeated a proposal to provide women the option of viewing a fetal ultrasound before an abortion.\(^{15}\) • The Kentucky Legislature is advancing a similar bill.\(^{16}\) That same state allows a minor to have an abortion without parental consent if there is a judicial override of parental notification. A Kentucky Court of Appeal has ruled that minors from other states can utilize this provision in Kentucky.\(^{17}\) • The New Hampshire Legislature is considering requiring parental notification before an abortion on a minor.\(^{18}\) • The Vermont Legislature is considering a proposal to legalize assisted suicide in that state.\(^{19}\)
